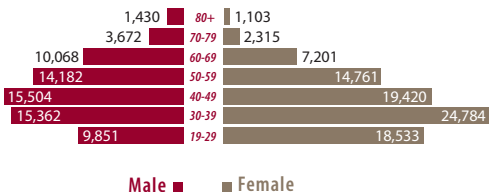

Sustainable development achievements:

- \$31M saved in energy and water bills since 1993
- Eight out of ten campus community members use sustainable transportation options to travel to campus
- Over 36% reduction in direct greenhouse gas emissions since 1974 while the facilities tripled in size and the number of students more than doubled
- Solid waste to landfill reduced by 78% since 1987, namely from 2,800 to 600 tonnes
